Rotary Club of East Lake Sunrise

The Rotary Club of East Lake Sunrise meets weekly. Membership is by invitation and is on the basis of one representative for each business, profession, and institution. This classification system ensures a cross-section of community representation.

Weekly Meetings

The Rotary Club of East Lake Sunrise meets weekly on Thursdays, at 8:00 A.M. for one hour. You are welcome to bring a guest to Rotary. If the guest would be a potential new member, the Club will pay for the meal of the guest.

Attendance

The Club wants you to attend the weekly meetings. Attendance is kept at each meeting. Consistent attendance helps keep us focused on Rotary ideals and to foster a strong and active club.

Make ups

You are encouraged to attend meetings at other clubs. There are Rotary Clubs worldwide, and you are welcome to attend any meeting. This is an exciting -- and easy -- way to meet new people and experience Rotary at other clubs.

Meals and Dues

The Club will bill you for dues quarterly, or annually if requested. Meals are ordered and paid for at meeting or can be billed. Membership Dues include dues for the Club, the District, and to Rotary International and includes the "Rotarian" magazine.

What is Rotary?

Rotary is an organization of business and professional people united worldwide, who provide humanitarian service, encourage high ethical standards in all vocations, and help to build good will in the world. The Rotary motto is: *SERVICE ABOVE SELF*.

Origin of Rotary

The first Rotary Club was organized in 1905 in Chicago, Illinois, by Paul Harris, a young lawyer. The name of the new organization was derived from the fact that the original members met in rotation at their various places of business. In 1910, Rotary became international with the formation of a club in Winnepeg, Canada.

The Object of Rotary

The object of Rotary is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular, to encourage and foster:

- Development and friendship as an opportunity for service.
- High ethical standards in business and professions; the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations; and the dignity of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society.
- The application of the ideal of service by every Rotarian in personal, business, and community life.
- The advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and fellowship of business and professional people united in the ideal
 of service.

Four Avenues of Service

Rotary has four avenues or reasons that it uses for service.

- Club Service includes all the programs at each meeting and other activities organized by the local club.
- Community Service focuses on involving the membership in community based projects.
- Vocational Service is responsible for educating our members and others about businesses and vocations in our community.
- International Service is mainly involved with exchange student programs, the group study exchange (for adults), and the many special programs of the Rotary International Foundation.
